Dear Parish Family,

Today we celebrate the Solemnity of Pentecost, the sending of the Holy Spirit. The word *Pentecost* means the fiftieth day. Pentecost was the Greek name given to the Jewish Feast of Weeks, which fell on the fiftieth day after Passover. Our Pentecost falls on the fiftieth day after Easter. Today also marks the end of the liturgical season of Easter. During the Easter Season the Paschal or Easter Candle is lit at all Masses. After today, the Paschal or Easter candle will only be lit for baptisms and funerals.

Tomorrow we return to Ordinary Time. During Ordinary Time, "the mystery of Christ itself is honored in all its fulness." During Ordinary Time, green vestments are worn. In the Liturgy, green is the color of hope.

Vacation Bible School is normally in July. However, this year it will be early in the summer so people will be able to

attend the National Eucharistic Congress in July. Mark your calendar for June 24-28, 2024 from 6:30 p.m. to 8:30 p.m. for children entering pre 4 to 4th grade in the fall. 
