

Welcome to all of them and to all our returning administration, faculty, staff, and students and their families.

Currently we are running low on Mass intentions. It has been part of the Catholic tradition to offer Masses especially for the deceased. It seems that today that tradition is being lost. Personally I offer Masses for several deceased family members and friends each year. For example, I offer a Mass for my father and mother on their birthday and their date of death. Also, I very much appreciate all the Masses offered for me since I was diagnosed with cancer.

In the September 14, 2007 edition of *The Criterion*, Archbishop Daniel wrote:

We also received the tradition of offering stipends when we wish to request the celebration of a Mass for a particular intention or for a deceased loved one....The request for a special intention is a petition that both priest and community specially unite with the Church's offering of Christ to the Father. The stipend is a material way to add to that spiritual offering of Christ to the Father.

The 1983 Code of Canon Law put it more succinctly in two canons:

Can. 945 §1. In accord with the approved practice of the Church, any priest celebrating or concelebrating is permitted to receive an offering to apply the Mass for a specific intention.

§2. It is recommended earnestly to priests that they celebrate Mass for the intention of the Christian faithful, especially the needy, even if they have not received an offering.

Can. 946 The Christian faithful who give an offering to apply the Mass for their intention contribute to the good of the Church and by that offering share its concern to support its ministers and works.



HIGHLIGHTS OF THE JULY LITTLE FLOWER PARISH PASTORAL COUNCIL MEETING

- Reviewed, updated, and approved changes to the St. Therese of the Infant Jesus Parish Pastoral Council Constitution (By-Laws). Two changes were made: 1. Removed the membership of the Athletic Commission from the council since it will be under the direction of Little Flower School. 2. The Invite Commission was added with the Faith Formation and Spiritual Development Commission. It was noted that a summary of each council meeting will be published in the parish bulletin.
- ➤ New Member Discussion The council discussed potential new members and officers to replace those whose terms will expire in the coming months. A list of candidates will be sent to council members for selection and Father Bob's approval.
- ➤ Strategic Plan A detailed review and update regarding the St. Therese Little Flower Catholic Church Strategic Growth Plan was conducted by the council. A review of accomplishments and work in progress with the three goals (Goal #1 Get more people invested and active. Goal #2 Increase Mass attendance with importance of the Eucharist. Goal #3 Focus community outreach towards areas of most need and available resources) were discussed. Progress has been made in many areas of the plan and the council will continue to focus on the goals. The work of St. Vincent DePaul in the parish and the need for additional Eucharistic Ministers were noted.
- ➤ The upcoming National Eucharistic Revival in Indianapolis was discussed. Parishioners from the parish attended the NEC and the Holy Spirit to St. Philip Neri Pilgrimage on Monday, July 15, 2024.
- ➤ Current State of the Parish Angie Mackell reported on the kitchen remodeling project in the parish center, construction project with the HVAC system in the parish center, Summerfest financial performance, Alumni/Development Fund performance, and the planning for the 100th Little Flower Parish Anniversary celebration and events.
- ➤ Commission Reports Council members were provided commission reports prior to the meeting for review and discussed them at the meeting. It was noted that the Welcoming Committee is seeking ideas and suggestions to best engage new parishioners.
