Please contact the Parish Center if you or a loved one are hospitalized, or are confined to home or a nursing facility, to receive the Eucharist and/or Anointing. Hospitals and healthcare facilities no longer routinely inform churches when a parishioner is admitted.



Dear Parish Family,

This Thursday, August 15, is the Solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary, a Holyday of Obligation. The Assumption celebrates our belief that at the end of her earthly life, Mary was taken up body and soul into heaven. Although the Assumption was celebrated as a feast day for centuries, the dogma of the Assumption was defined by Pope Pius XII on November 1, 1950. Holyday Masses will be at 9:30 a.m. and 6:00 p.m.

Next weekend, August 17-18, Sr. Marj English, OSF, an Oldenburg Franciscan, will ask for our prayers and financial support for the sisters' mission endeavors. Please be as generous as possible. The Oldenburg Franciscans gave so much to Little Flower as school administrators and teachers and parish pastoral associates. Sister Marj has written a letter of introduction to us. After considerable thought over the past few weeks, I have decided to add a part-time position to the parish staff. 



First Eucharist and Reconciliation



PLEASE READ JENNIFER DYE'S JOURNEY OF FATIH:

Hello,

It's difficult when you attempt to sit down and put into words something that matters so much to you. Do I start in the beginning? It's all kind of the beginning of my journey when I really stop to think about it.

I was raised in a non-Catholic home in a non-Catholic extended family and as I grew up that's what I was expected to be, not Catholic. The space to truly practice it and what it means to me I didn't have.

Our lives were uprooted in 2016 and my son and I landed at this wonderful, little school that someone had told me about. It was supposed to be temporary, but it became our refuge and our community in time. My son started singing in the liturgical choir, so I came to Mass and then as the years progressed, I attended even if the choir wasn't singing. I had no idea what I was doing during Mass but by then I had friends that helped. I started inviting my family to see the choir sing, they started learning that Catholic wasn't necessarily something bad.

A few years ago, I asked difficult questions I had been too afraid to ask before. Would the Catholic Church take someone like me? Could I become Catholic if I was X, Y, and Z? My questions posed to the OCIA team were met with compassion and a lot of grace I might add. The entire process from that first tentative email to the Easter Vigil almost two years later, I never felt like I was alone. Let me be clear though, my choice to convert was always one hundred percent mine.

My family you ask? They are incredibly supportive, surprisingly my biggest supporters! We all had a lot to learn before everything fell into place. We talk about our own individual faith now and what that means to us, but we talk about it together.

I am beginning to get more involved in the parish and finding where my talents serve best. I'm looking forward to seeing where that is going to take me, what I will learn about myself and my faith in the process, as well as what I will learn from other members of the parish and within the Little Flower community.

I cannot say enough wonderful things about the OCIA (formerly RCIA) classes and the team (which I will be helping with this year)! The content and the scripture are thought provoking along with the discussions in class that are kind and insightful. If you have considered attending even just one class, I strongly encourage you to, and if you don't want to go alone, I'll meet you there.
