

Dear Parish Family,

Thank you for your generosity to Sr. Marj English who requested our prayers and financial support. Sister reported some interesting statistics about the relationship between the Oldenburg Franciscans and Little Flower:

At one time Little Flower was one of our missions. From 1926 to 1993, 174 different sisters served here as either a teacher, a principal, or in a pastoral capacity. At least 25 women entered our community from Little Flower...

Sister also told a story about Sr. Mary Schmidlin who came from Little Flower:

Sr. Mary Schmidlin, a vocation from this parish, is now 88 and a resident in our health care facility. She coordinates Little Portion Club endeavors with Sr. Amy Kistner. She plays cards with a group of us most evenings and at one time shared a cheer they used to do in her kickball days. I think if she were here, she might break into the cheer: "Little Flower, show your power in this hour."

Angie Mackell told Sister some of our kickball teams still use a variation of this cheer: "Little Flower, show your power, help us win this game today."

In talking about the Little Portion Club, Sister Marj made several references to Papua, New Guinea, and the sisters' missionary work there. Sr. Martine

Mayborg was my first grade teacher at Little Flower in 1955-1956. Little Flower was her first teaching assignment, and she was only 19 years old at the time. She was one of the four original sisters to go to New Guinea. She remained there for 50 years and was the last Oldenburg Franciscan to leave New Guinea.

This Thursday I will be going to Oldenburg to celebrate Mass for the Sisters and to visit with them.

Tuesday is the feast of St. Monica, the mother of St. Augustine. St. Monica is the patroness of mothers. Through her prayers, she gained the conversion of her pagan husband and of St. Augustine who had lived a wild life until the age of 33. Wednesday is the feast of St. Augustine. It was St. Augustine who wrote, "My heart will never rest until it rests in you, O Lord." Because our heart is open to the infinite, nothing—no person, no thing—other than God— can make us perfectly happy.

Thursday is the feast of the Passion or Martyrdom of St. John the Baptist. John the Baptist was the last prophet of the Old Testament and first prophet of the New Testament. John the Baptist was arrested and ultimately beheaded because John had criticized King Herod for marrying Herodius, his brother Philip's wife.




First Eucharist and Reconciliation

REFLECTIONS ON THE NATIONAL EUCHARISTIC CONGRESS

I was nervous to go on my own...getting myself there, parking, etc. I like having a partner in crime to walk with me and guide me so I don't have to do a lot of thinking, but, I did have to attend and get myself there on my own. I learned that I am braver than I think I am and I am ok being by myself and finding my way.

I looked forward to meeting my friends with a new renewed feeling of friendship and gratitude that there were friends waiting for me at the end of my journey...and that I was never alone. There were 53,000 family members walking alongside of me everywhere! I have never felt such a connection to people in my whole life that I have never met before, knowing that we were all there with a common Father sharing the same faith, connected by the same spirit. Everywhere I turned there was a smile on people's faces...no sense of worry on any one face....their faces were beautiful! I found myself smiling like crazy, saying hello to everyone and at one point leading the way for fellow walkers to the front of the Convention. We were not single persons, we were pilgrims!

The talks were fantastic. The speakers were well organized, knowledgeable and provoked a lot of thoughts. I went to one lecture on "politics and the Catholic faith"...how to talk and be with parishioners on each side of the aisle. The speaker had us engage in a very tricky exercise...he had us sing "We are one in the spirit, we are one in the Lord" (the whole first verse of *They Will Know We Are Christians by Our Love*), which kept our commonality in the front and our political preference in the back...very tricky indeed. So simple but so powerful.

The music was awesome whether it be during the evening program of adoration or during Mass. I attended the orthodox Eastern rite Syro-Malabar Qurbana Mass and the music was so beautiful...hypnotic almost. It has me listening to praise music ever since I attended the convention...something I had never done before.

The most dramatic thing I saw besides all that we were given in the adoration, the inspiring programs, the people and the overall general feeling of fellowship was on Saturday night. Archbishop Barron had just spoken. Music had started to play and I thought, "This is a good time to go to the bathroom"....they are going to play at least one song...now is my time to go. However, I did not know they were going to start adoration again. I finished in the bathroom and found the stadium silent and dark for adoration. My surprise came to me as I was walking to my seat...there at the entrance of the stadium, before you descend the steps to your seat, were at least 10 stadium concession stand workers at the entrance...looking on in wonder and silence...some on their knees...looking at the blessed sacrament...we were touching them in a most profound way...it was on their faces to behold. As Deacon Harold Burke-Sivers had said that very morning in his breakout session talk, ...throw the mustard seeds and let them fall where they may...the Lord will do the heavy lifting from there...but you must throw the seed!!


