

SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM

Baptisms are held on most Sundays during the year. Baptisms are held after the 9:30 am Mass. If you prefer to have your child's baptism scheduled during Mass, you may request this at the time you return the baptism information form. Requests for the date and time specified will be honored to the extent possible. Parents who have not yet received pre-baptismal instruction are required to attend a Baptismal Preparation Class that is held 5 times per year. Call the Parish Office well in advance so that class arrangements may be made.

SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE

Contact the priest 9 to 12 months in advance. A Wedding Handbook is available from the Parish Office which provides the necessary information on arranging for a marriage.

SACRAMENT OF ANOINTING/MINISTRY TO THE SICK

In an emergency, contact the parish at any time. Please contact the Parish Center if you or a loved one are hospitalized, or are confined to home or a nursing facility, to receive the Eucharist and/or Anointing. Hospitals and healthcare facilities no longer routinely inform churches when a parishioner is admitted.

Dear Parish Family,

Although the Feast of St. Therese was on October 1, as a parish, we are celebrating her Feast at all the Masses this weekend. Likewise, our Parish Appreciation Dinner is this Saturday, October 5, after the 5:30 p.m. Mass. This dinner is our "thank you" for your generous gifts of time, talent, and treasure that help make our parish the wonderful faith community that we all enjoy.

Tuesday, October 1, was her feast day. This is the third date for her feast. Her feast was originally on September 30, the anniversary of her death in 1897. From 1927-1969, her feast day was on October 3. One of the reasons for this date was because October 1 was not available because of the then current liturgical calendar. One website suggested that it was moved to October 1 because of an ancient custom of celebrating a saint's entry into heaven on the day following their death.

St. Therese was named a Doctor of the Church by St. Pope John Paul II on October 19, 1997.

If we believe in God's providence, we believe that God's providence is at work during this month's synod. The Second Session of the Synod began this past Wednesday, October 2, and will end on Sunday, October 27. Please pray every day, through the intercession of St. Therese, for the Holy Spirit to enlighten the minds and hearts of all the Synod participants. Please keep informed about the Synod through The Criterion and other Catholic news sources.

Monday, October 7, is the Memorial of Our Lady of the Rosary. The Rosary is one of the principal devotions to the Blessed Virgin Mary. When those of us who are older were growing up, there were three sets of mysteries: the Joyful, Sorrowful, and Glorious Mysteries. St. Pope John Paul II added the Luminous Mysteries: the Baptism in the Jordan, the Wedding at Cana, the Proclamation of the Kingdom, the Transfiguration, and the Institution of the Eucharist.

Friday is the feast of St. Pope John XXIII. Pope John was elected Pope at the age of 78. Because of his age, he was expected to be a caretaker of the Church. However, it was he who convened the Second Vatican Council which lasted from 1962 to 1965. The Second Vatican Council opened on October 11, 1962. Pope Francis was 76 when he was elected Pope.

Finally, next weekend please welcome Fr. Jim Farrell who will celebrate all the Masses. I will be in Cincinnati to witness the marriage of Anna Tropf, my first cousin twice removed. In other words, her great-grandmother was my aunt, and her grandmother was my first cousin. For those who may remember my mother, Anna's great-grandmother, Julia McNally, lived with my mother. Please pray that I will have a safe trip.

Catholics from across central and southern Indiana are invited to take part in a series of listening sessions that will be part of a pastoral planning process for the Archdiocese of Indianapolis. Members of parishes in the Indianapolis deaneries are especially encouraged to attend.

Archdiocesan leaders have noted that answering these three questions will involve listening, prayerful discernment, and collaborative engagement.



The parish needs your help with a couple of issues regarding Eucharistic Ministers.

• Since we resumed distributing the cup for Holy Communion, we have been using only four cup ministers. Prior to the pandemic we always used six ministers. Only using four cup ministers is causing some congestion as more people decide to resume reception from the cup. We really need to return to six ministers to make the distribution of communion more efficient.

• We are still experiencing a shortage of Head Eucharistic Ministers. This is especially critical at the Sunday 6:00 p.m. Mass.

We need your help with both of these issues.

An Extraordinary Minister of Holy Communion is a person who is baptized and confirmed and living a life in conformity with the Gospel and the laws and teachings of the Catholic Church and who shows reverence and love for the Eucharist.

1. Please consider becoming a Eucharistic Minister if you are not currently serving. We will be having a special training session on Saturday, October 12, at 1:00 p.m. in church, but individual sessions can be arranged if you can't make that time work. We have a need at all Masses, with the most need at the 6:00 p.m. Mass

2. If you are currently a minister, please consider becoming a Head Minister. Training will be provided.

3. Most importantly, if you are currently a Minister at the 6:00 p.m. Mass on Sunday, please consider serving as a Head Minister. The current shortage is causing an undue burden on just a few people.
