SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM

Baptisms are held on most Sundays during the year. Baptisms are held after the 9:30 am Mass. If you prefer to have your child's baptism scheduled during Mass, you may request this at the time you return the baptism information form. Requests for the date and time specified will be honored to the extent possible. Parents who have not yet received pre-baptismal instruction are required to attend a Baptismal Preparation Class that is held 5 times per year. Call the Parish Office well in advance so that class arrangements may be made.

SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE

Contact the priest 9 to 12 months in advance. A Wedding Handbook is available from the Parish Office which provides the necessary information on arranging for a marriage.

SACRAMENT OF ANOINTING/MINISTRY TO THE SICK

In an emergency, contact the parish at any time. Please contact the Parish Center if you or a loved one are hospitalized, or are confined to home or a nursing facility, to receive the Eucharist and/or Anointing. Hospitals and healthcare facilities no longer routinely inform churches when a parishioner is admitted.

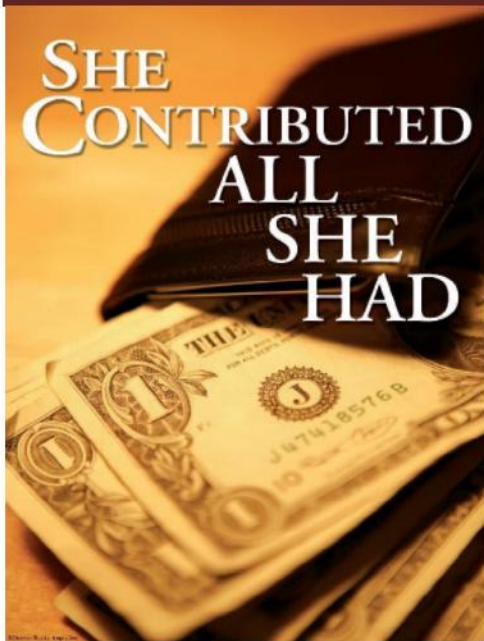

Mass of Anointing
 On Thursday, November 14, at the 5:30 p.m. Mass, we will celebrate a community Mass of Anointing of the Sick.

Once called “Last Rites,” anointing is no longer reserved for the dying, but is seen as a sacrament of inner healing. The Rite of Anointing suggests the following guidelines for those who wish to be anointed: “Great care should be taken to see that those of the faithful whose health is seriously impaired by sickness or old age receive this sacrament...A sick person may be anointed before surgery whenever a serious illness is the reason for the surgery. Elderly people may be anointed if they have become notably weakened even though no serious illness is present.” (Rite 8, 10, & 11) Please call Jeannie Zimmerman, 317-357-8352, if you plan on attending and would like to be anointed.
