Dear Parish Family,

Today we celebrate the OCIA (Order of Christian Initiation of Adults) Rite of Acceptance & Welcoming at the 9:30 a.m. Mass. In this rite, our catechumens and candidates are asked to publicly declare their intentions to continue their journey towards becoming Catholic and to more fully embrace the Gospel message with God's help. They are signed with the Cross to show that they belong to Christ. Also, in this rite, the parish community more fully participates in and prays for those in the OCIA process. We encourage all parishioners to reach out to them as fellow members of the household of Christ.

As most of you know, last Sunday I announced that I will be retiring on July 2, 2025. For those who may not have been here or who may have missed some of what I said, I wanted to recap my talk.

- 1. When a priest turns 75, he is no longer eligible to continue as pastor but may be appointed administrator. As you know, I turned 75 on August 6. On October 17, I received a letter from Archbishop Thompson appointing me administrator until July 2, 2025.
- 2. Every year in the early fall, the Archdiocese asks priests their preferences concerning their assignment for the following July. I asked to remain at Little Flower for the first year of our 100th anniversary celebration. Archbishop Thompson, however, has asked me to retire on July 2, 2025.
- 3. Last Sunday Fr. Rick Ginther, pastor of Our Lady of Lourdes, made a similar announcement. The big difference is that he had already announced that he was retiring next July.
- 4. The reason the Archbishop is requesting my retirement is because he plans to appoint a pastor who will be pastor of both Little Flower and Our Lady of Lourdes.
- 5. Our two parishes are not being combined. They will continue to be separate parishes. However, the Archbishop strongly feels that it is best for both parishes and the new pastor that the pastor be assigned for both parishes at the same time.
- 6. The Archbishop's decision actually makes complete sense to me.
 - a. Because of the shortage of priests and the size and proximity of both parishes, such an arrangement is inevitable. This is happening at many parishes, and it provides not only for the reality of the number of priests we have, but also cooperation and coordination between the parishes.
 - b. I had already decided that I was going to retire in one more year, i.e., July 2026.
 - c. Because I am very tired and have little energy as a result of my cancer treatment, I have come to realize that I am not able to do as much as I used to do.
- 7. When this becomes effective in July, the new pastor will live at Our Lady of Lourdes initially. The Archbishop has graciously decided that I may continue to live in the rectory for at least a year until I have a plan for retirement and a place to live. I am extremely grateful for this.
- 8. As part of the process for appointing a new pastor, the Archdiocese sends two priests from the Personnel Board to meet with the parish leadership including the Parish Council, the parish staff, and me to discern the needs of the parish. This will happen soon. Fr. Steve Giannini and Fr. Aaron Jenkins will be the two priests.
- 9. What role, if any, I will have in the parish next year will completely depend on the new pastor, and I am fine with that. Although I have no idea who the new pastor will be, I will want the transition to be as smooth as possible and will want to completely support the new pastor and hope you will also.
- 10. Many years ago, two older pastors shared their wisdom with me. One told me that whenever there is a change in pastors, there is at least a temporary decline in Mass attendance. The second told me that whenever there is a change in pastors, there is at least a temporary decline in financial contributions. I hope and pray that neither of these will happen at Little Flower.
- 11. In my first Sunday homily here almost 22 years ago, I said, "I believe this parish is your parish." In the almost 22 years I have been here, we have done wonderful things together. My hope and my prayer is that you will continue to see this parish as your parish and continue to support it as generously as you have throughout my time here.
- 12. For many of us, including me, change can be very difficult especially because it brings a lot of uncertainty. Right now it is important that we continue to live in the present, i.e., day by day. As we move into the future with all its uncertainty, faith will be very important. We will need to entrust ourselves and our future as parishioners and as a parish to God. As Jesus said, "'Do not worry about tomorrow; tomorrow will take care of itself" [Mt. 6:34].
- 13. Please pray for Little Flower parish and school, for me, for yourselves, and for vocations to the priesthood.


