#### SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM

Baptisms are held on most Sundays during the year. Baptisms are held after the 9:30 am Mass. If you prefer to have your child's baptism scheduled during Mass, you may request this at the time you return the baptism information form. Requests for the date and time specified will be honored to the extent possible. Parents who have not yet received pre-baptismal instruction are required to attend a Baptismal Preparation Class that is held 5 times per year. Call the Parish Office well in advance so that class arrangements may be made.

#### SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE

Contact the priest 9 to 12 months in advance. A Wedding Handbook is available from the Parish Office which provides the necessary information on arranging for a marriage.

#### SACRAMENT OF ANOINTING/MINISTRY TO THE SICK

In an emergency, contact the parish at any time. Please contact the Parish Center if you or a loved one are hospitalized, or are confined to home or a nursing facility, to receive the Eucharist and/or Anointing. Hospitals and healthcare facilities no longer routinely inform churches when a parishioner is admitted.



Dear Parish Family,

Today we celebrate the Solemnity of Christ the King, the last Sunday of the Church year. This feast was instituted by Pope Pius XI at the close of the 1925 Holy Year. He wanted to emphasize the kingship of Christ over all creation. In the Preface of the Mass, we pray, "You anointed Jesus Christ, your only Son, with the oil of gladness, as the eternal priest and universal king."

Today we commission all of our lectors, servers, music ministers, ministers of hospitality, and arts and environment ministers at all of our weekend Masses. We very much appreciate the contributions of these ministers who enrich our

liturgy on a weekly basis.

This Thursday, November 28, is Thanksgiving Day. **Our Thanksgiving Day Mass will be at 9:30 a.m.** Even in these difficult economic times, as a nation, we have much for which to be grateful. The three best ways to give thanks for all our blessings on Thanksgiving Day are to celebrate Eucharist as a family, spend quality time with our family and/or friends, and share some of our blessings with those in need. Little Flower School will anticipate the celebration of Thanksgiving with an all-school Mass on Tuesday at 9:30 a.m.

Likewise, we as a parish and a school have many reasons to be grateful. We have beautiful Liturgies. Our parish continues to thrive. We continue to thrive because of you. So many of you are so generous with your time, talent, and treasure. We thrive because we have a wonderful, dedicated staff. We thrive because Little Flower School is blessed with dedicated teachers, administration, and staff, supportive parents, a supportive parish, and generous and committed alumni.

On Thanksgiving Day, there will be a collection to benefit the St. Vincent de Paul Society. Because of the economy, our St. Vincent de Paul Society will be stretched thinner than ever with more people in need and possibly fewer donations. Thank you to all who returned Thanksgiving Blessing Bags or donated gift cards.

You are also invited to bring food for your own dinner. Please do not place this food on the steps. You will be invited to bring it forward to be blessed at the end of Mass.

Because of Thanksgiving, the parish offices and school will be closed on Thursday and Friday, November 28 and 29.

**Next Sunday will be the First Sunday of Advent, the beginning of a new church year.** Just as we make resolutions on January 1, next Sunday will be a good time to make faith resolutions. I would like to encourage you to **resolve** to attend Sunday Mass more faithfully. Since COVID, attendance year over year has only slightly increased. We appear to have flattened out with our post pandemic attendance increases and are still 100 people down each weekend from our pre-pandemic attendance. Sunday Eucharist is at the heart of our identity as Catholic Christians and as a parish. Thank you for considering this request.

Giving Tree tags will also be available next Sunday. Please note the full announcement about the Giving Tree. The Giving Tree gifts are one way in which we become Christ to others, and they become Christ to us.

Also, please mark your calendar now. **Our Advent Penance Service will be Wednesday, December 4, at 7:00 p.m. here at Little Flower.** As is our tradition, we will be joined by the parishioners of Our Lady of Lourdes. Also, our First Communicants will be celebrating the Sacrament of Reconciliation for the first time.




Please join us for Mass on Thanksgiving Day at 9:30 am, so that we might together give thanks to God for all the blessings we have been given.




