

This Monday, January 20, our nation celebrates the birth of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. Both our parish office and our school will be closed in honor of Dr. King. I am always moved by Dr. King's words in his "I Have A Dream" speech delivered on the steps of the Lincoln Memorial on August 28, 1963: "I have a dream that my four children will one day live in a nation where they will not be judged by the color of their skin but by the content of their character." In that same speech, Dr. King reminded his listeners, "...unearned suffering is redemptive."

This Wednesday, January 22, the Catholic Church in the United States marks the anniversary of the Supreme Court decision *Roe v Wade* which legalized abortion throughout the United States with a **Day of Prayer for the Legal Protection of Unborn Children**. Although *Roe v Wade* was overturned by the Supreme Court decision *Dobbs v*.

Jackson Women's Health Organization, the battle for the legal protection of unborn children has now moved to the states. Therefore, the 5:30 p.m. Mass will be the Mass for "For Giving Thanks to God for the Gift of Human Life." Please join us as we give thanks for the gift of human life and pray for the legal protection of unborn children.

Friday, January 24, is the feast of St. Francis de Sales, Bishop and Doctor of the Church. As bishop of Geneva, he tried to bring many people back to the Church by his writings and by the witness of his life. For many years, St. Francis de Sales Parish was our neighboring parish. It is now the home of Martin University.

Saturday, January 25, is the Feast of the Conversion of St. Paul. Saturday also marks the sixth anniversary of the death of Archbishop Daniel Buechlein, O.S.B.






