Dear Parish Family,

This Sunday, February 2, is the Feast of the Presentation of the Lord. Today we celebrate the Presentation of Jesus in the temple. Today is also called Candlemas Day because it was the day on which the candles to be used during the year would be blessed.

Monday, February 3, is the feast of St. Blaise, Bishop and Martyr. Because St. Blaise saved a choking child, he is the patron saint for healing diseases of the throat, and, therefore, the blessing of throats is associated with the feast of St. Blaise. Throats will be individually blessed during the 5:30 p.m. Mass on Monday, February 3, and at the 9:30 a.m. All-School Mass on Friday, February 7.

Next Sunday is World Marriage Day. Therefore, there will be a blessing for married couples and engaged couples at all the Masses next weekend.

We had a wonderful Catholic Schools Week this past week beginning last Sunday. First, Kevin Gawrys, our principal, spoke at all the Masses. I want to thank Mr. Gawrys for all the kind things he said about me although some of them were a bit exaggerated. Second, the Liturgical Choir directed by Ms. Brandi Caruthers and accompanied by Mr. Tom Costello did an excellent

job at the 9:30 a.m. Mass. I forgot to congratulate and thank them at the end of Mass. Thank you, and congratulations! Third, we had a very successful open house following the 9:30 a.m. Mass. Fourteen new families registered 17 new students. Thanks to all the administration, faculty, staff, parents, students, and organizations who worked so hard to make Open House a success. Of course, there were all kinds of special activities during the week.

Mr. Gawrys was correct that I have always said that parents choose Catholic schools for one or more than one of three reasons: discipline, academics, and/or faith traditions. As he said, discipline is not punishment. Rather, discipline provides students with an orderly, structured environment that calls forth the best in them and enables them to grow into the-best-version-of-themselves. A school has no reason to exist if it does not provide children with a quality education that will prepare them for the next stages of their education and to live well in today's world. We are always called to improve the quality of our education. However, the only real reason for a Catholic school to exist is to share the Good News of Jesus Christ by word and example.

Besides what Mr. Gawrys shared, I have one other core belief about Catholic school education. First, I believe that a Catholic school should be a microcosm of a parish. In other words, the school should embody the best qualities of the parish. What draws people to Little Flower parish is that we are a warm, welcoming, accepting parish and we have beautiful Liturgy. This same is true of our school. When I first arrived 22 years ago, one of the first things I noticed was the close relationship between parish and school. This often is not true.

Today I would like to thank our administration, faculty, staff, students, families, alumni, and friends who help Little Flower continue to be the excellent mission-driven school it has always been.

As you may remember, last year's festival proceeds were directed toward extra security cameras around the campus. Recently we had five new cameras installed, both internally and externally, including two inside the church building. A third camera will be added in the near future. It is our hope that these extra security measures help ensure the safety and well being of our parish family and community.

Finally, I will have my second cataract surgery this Tuesday.
