Requests for the date and time specified will be honored to the extent possible. Parents who have not yet received pre-baptismal instruction are required to attend a Baptismal Preparation Class that is held 5 times per year. Call the Parish Office well in advance so that class arrangements may be made.

Contact the priest 9 to 12 months in advance. A Wedding Handbook is available from the Parish Office which provides the necessary information on arranging for a marriage.

#### SACRAMENT OF ANOINTING/MINISTRY TO THE SICK

In an emergency, contact the parish at any time. Please contact the Parish Center if you or a loved one are hospitalized, or are confined to home or a nursing facility, to receive the Eucharist and/or Anointing. Hospitals and healthcare facilities no longer routinely inform churches when a parishioner is admitted.



Dear Parish Family,

This Monday, February 17, is Presidents' Day. People of my age and older remember when we celebrated Lincoln's birthday on February 12 and Washington's birthday on February 22. It seems that each year we had a free day from school on one of those dates. After several holidays were moved to Mondays, the celebration of Washington's birthday on the third Monday of February morphed into Presidents' Day. In honor of Presidents' Day, Little Flower School will be closed on Monday.

Monday is also the optional memorial of the Seven Holy Founders of the Servite Order. The Servite Order promotes devotion to our Lady of Sorrows. As some of you may remember, for many years, Little Flower parishioners attended Sorrowful Mother Novena devotions on Friday evenings at 7:00 p.m. This devotion began at Little Flower on April 24, 1959. Little Flower was featured in the *Sorrowful Mother Novena Notes* of May 15, 1959. There was a picture of our filled church and a picture of Fr. John. According to the article,

On Friday, April 24, over a thousand parishioners of *St. Therese of the Infant Jesus* Parish in Indianapolis joined our kneeling ranks. Under the leadership of Father Brissette, and guided by the manly holiness of their Pastor, Father John C. Riedinger, the throngs pictured here enrolled in our Fatima Crusade for Peace and the Conversion of Russia. We are proud to welcome newest Novenites from Indi-ana—always an ardent supporter of Our Novena and its varied activities.

The Seven Sorrows of Mary are: 1. The Prophecy of Simeon [Lk. 2: 25-35]; 2. The Flight into Egypt [Mt. 2: 13-15]; 3. The Child Jesus Lost in the Temple [Lk. 2: 41-50]; 4. Mary meets Jesus carrying the cross [Lk. 23: 27-29]; 5. Mary at the foot of the cross [Jn. 19: 25-30]; 6. Mary receives the body of Jesus [Ps. 130]; and 7. Mary witnesses the burial of Jesus [Lk. 23: 50-56].

Saturday is the Feast of the Chair of Saint Peter the Apostle. A chair is a symbol of teaching authority. Tuesday would be an appropriate day to pray for Pope Francis. This prayer comes from the former Sacramentary:

Father of providence, look with love on Francis our Pope, your appointed successor to St. Peter on whom you built your Church. May he be the visible center and foundation of our unity in faith and love. We ask this through Christ, our Lord.

In the pre-Vatican II Liturgy, there were two feasts of the Chair of St. Peter. On January 18, the Church celebrated the Feast of St. Peter at Rome. On February 22, the Church celebrated the Feast of the Chair of St. Peter at Antioch. Before moving to Rome, St. Peter was bishop of the Church of Antioch. However, until the 16<sup>th</sup> century, February 22 was the Feast of the Chair of St. Peter at Rome!

Finally, Valentine's Day was the anniversary of the death of Msgr. Stanley (Duke) Manowski, a priest of the Diocese of Fort Wayne-South Bend. He liked brain teasers. This was one of his favorites for school children: "A man had 3 children and 23 horses. When he died, he left one child  $\frac{1}{2}$  of his horses, another child  $\frac{1}{3}$  of his horses, and the last child  $\frac{1}{8}$  of his horses. How many horses did each child receive?"

desserts. Please feel free to bring your favorite side dish, or dessert but it is not obligatory. We hope you will join us to celebrate a little bit of Irish.


