SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM

Baptisms are held on most Sundays during the year. Baptisms are held after the 9:30 am Mass. If you prefer to have your child's baptism scheduled during Mass, you may request this at the time you return the baptism information form. Requests for the date and time specified will be honored to the extent possible. Parents who have not yet received pre-baptismal instruction are required to attend a Baptismal Preparation Class that is held 5 times per year. Call the Parish Office well in advance so that class arrangements may be made.

SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE

Contact the priest 9 to 12 months in advance. A Wedding Handbook is available from the Parish Office which provides the necessary information on arranging for a marriage.

SACRAMENT OF ANOINTING/MINISTRY TO THE SICK

In an emergency, contact the parish at any time. Please contact the Parish Center if you or a loved one are hospitalized, or are confined to home or a nursing facility, to receive the Eucharist and/or Anointing. Hospitals and healthcare facilities no longer routinely inform churches when a parishioner is admitted.

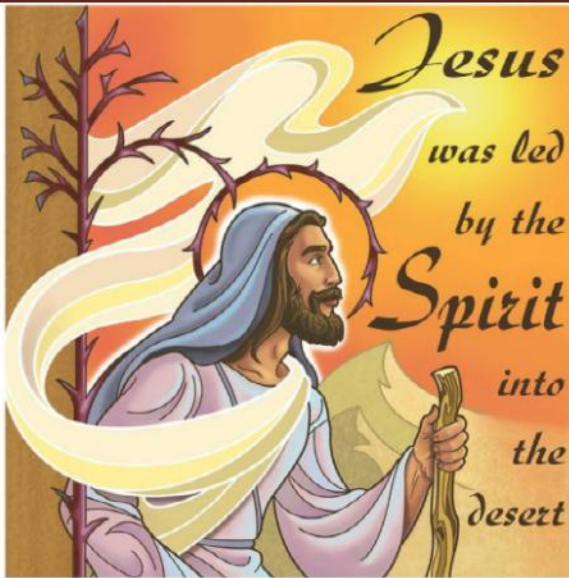

Dear Parish Family,

Today is the First Sunday of Lent. The Gospel for the First Sunday of Lent always tells the story of Jesus' temptations in the desert. Although Lent is a penitential season, the Church sees it as a gift from God. In the Second Preface of Lent, we pray, "This great season of grace is your gift to your family to renew us in spirit."

During Lent, our OCIA (Order of Christian Initiation of Adults) catechumens & candidates begin their final preparation for the sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation, and Eucharist which they will receive at the Easter Vigil Liturgy. This weekend we will celebrate the Rite of Sending at the 9:30 a.m. Mass.

We, as a community, send our catechumens and candidates to the Cathedral for the Rite of Election. At the Rite of Election, on the basis of the testimony of their sponsors and catechists and on the reaffirmation of the intention of the catechumens and candidates themselves, Archbishop Thompson, will declare them ready to take part in the Sacraments of Initiation. This year we have three catechumens. In addition, at the Easter Vigil, two candidates will be received into the Catholic Church and receive First Eucharist and Confirmation and two Catholics will receive the Sacrament of Confirmation.

This week our all-school Mass will be Monday, March 10, at 9:30 a.m.

Thursday, March 13, marks the 12th anniversary of the election of Pope Francis. Please continue to pray for him as he continues to fight serious infection.

All of us know that Lent began on Ash Wednesday. Most of us do not know or have forgotten that in the pre-Vatican II Liturgy there was what we might call a pre-Lent. Today Ordinary Time runs right up to Ash Wednesday. In the former Liturgy, pre-Lent began on the third Sunday before Ash Wednesday, which was called Septuagesima which represented the 70th day before Easter. It marked a stage toward the Lenten fast. Purple vestments were worn until Easter, and the *Gloria* and *Alleluia* were not sung.

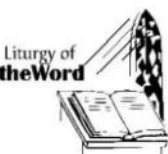

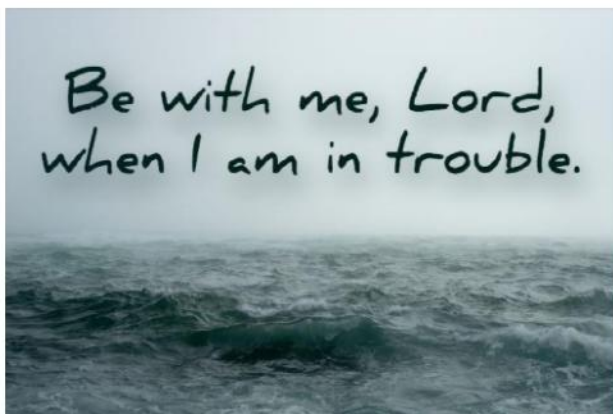
