SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM

Baptisms are held on most Sundays during the year. Baptisms are held after the 9:30 am Mass. If you prefer to have your child's baptism scheduled during Mass, you may request this at the time you return the baptism information form. Requests for the date and time specified will be honored to the extent possible. Parents who have not yet received pre-baptismal instruction are required to attend a Baptismal Preparation Class that is held 5 times per year. Call the Parish Office well in advance so that class arrangements may be made.

SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE

Contact the priest 9 to 12 months in advance. A Wedding Handbook is available from the Parish Office which provides the necessary information on arranging for a marriage.

SACRAMENT OF ANOINTING/MINISTRY TO THE SICK

In an emergency, contact the parish at any time. Please contact the Parish Center if you or a loved one are hospitalized, or are confined to home or a nursing facility, to receive the Eucharist and/or Anointing. Hospitals and healthcare facilities no longer routinely inform churches when a parishioner is admitted.

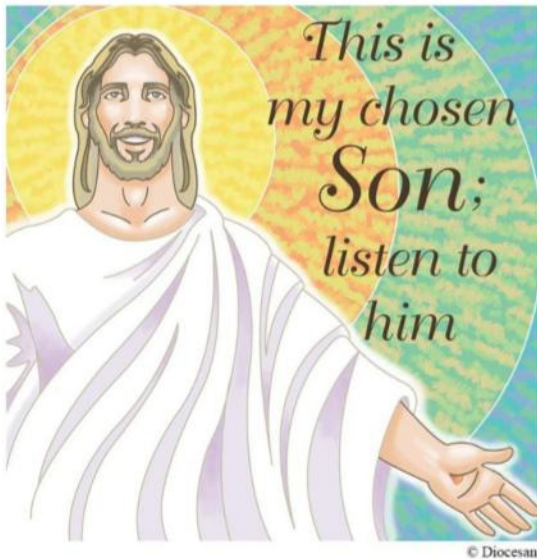

Dear Parish Family,

Today is the Second Sunday of Lent. The Gospel on the Second Sunday of Lent is always the story of Jesus' Transfiguration. The custom of reading this Gospel near the beginning of Lent may have come from an ancient tradition that Jesus' transfiguration came 40 days before Good Friday.

Our Lenten Penance Service will be this Thursday, March 20, at 7:00 p.m. at Our Lady of Lourdes. Several priests will hear confessions. As is our tradition, Our Lady of Lourdes and Little Flower celebrate Penance Services together.

During Lent, the Archdiocese schedules several of the annual special collections. However, sometimes additional collections are added in times of special need. Unfortunately it makes it seem as though the Church is asking for money all the time. The reason the Church

schedules these during Lent is because it is during Lent that we are especially called to prayer, fasting, and almsgiving. Please do not feel obligated to contribute to all of them. Although all are good causes, support the ones that you feel called to support.

As you know, the money that we receive through the Lenten baby banks is divided between the Gabriel Project and a charity designated by the parish. As a parish we have chosen once again to help Miracle Place here on the Eastside. Miracle Place, located at 940 Temple Avenue, provides education, meals, love, and encouragement to children and adults in their neighborhood.

Monday, of course, is St. Patrick's Day. My father came from Ireland in 1929. My mother's parents both came from Ireland. One my father's brothers and one of his sisters remained in Ireland. When I was studying in Rome, I was able to visit them and their families. Also, I was able to stay in the house in which he grew up. If you are planning to celebrate on Monday, it would be good to remember something Archbishop Daniel often said, "You can't fast and celebrate at the same time!"

Finally, if you have not already, this week you will receive a letter from me requesting your support for my final major project here at Little Flower, one that also recognizes the parish's 100th Anniversary. The letter will detail plans to have our church pews refinished. When you receive your letter, I hope you will be able to consider support of this project to whatever extent is possible for you and your circumstances.

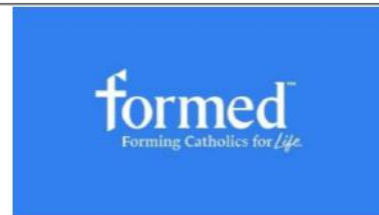
